What is family violence?

Family, or domestic violence, occurs when a family member intentionally uses violence, threats, coercion or intimidation to control or manipulate another family member, partner, or former partner.

Family violence includes:

- physical assault eg punching, hitting, kicking, pushing, slapping, choking
- sexual assault
- emotional and psychological abuse eg constant criticisms, name calling, belittling and putdowns
- verbal abuse
- threats of violence
- stalking
- financial abuse eg controlling access to money or how it is spent
- harming pets
- intentionally damaging property and belongings
- isolation from family, friends and social networks
- any behaviour that causes someone to live in fear

What does Minerva offer?

Minerva assists women and accompanying children who are experiencing family violence. We do this by:

- risk assessment and safety planning
- outreach support
- specialist support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women and children
- court support eg to obtain intervention orders
- secure crisis accommodation
- housing support
- advocacy
- information and referral

We also provide:

- secondary consultation
- community education

Who can access our programs?

Women, children and young people who have experienced, or are experiencing, family violence.

A referral is not required.

Interpreter services are available if needed.
